Christiana found inspiration in the stories of her cousins from Freetown. Their fluency in English and love for books sparked a flame of aspiration within her. Despite the taunts and jeers of her peers, who dubbed her the "Mother of the Children" due to her elder status in class, Christiana forged ahead undeterred.

She successfully completed her Basic Education Certificate Examination with flying colors. However, financial constraints denied her admission to Senior Secondary School. At a crossroads, she was lured by promises from a neighbor to find a job in Guinea, only to be deceived and trapped in a foreign land. The neighbor wanted her to marry an elderly man. With courage as her compass, Christiana made the arduous journey back to her homeland.

Upon her return to Kono, Christiana resumed gold mining to sustain herself and pursue her dreams. It was then that she learned about the *Chochendeh Village Savings and Loan Association (VSLA)*. Interested in joining, she found solace and opportunity within the group. With the guidance of the chair lady and the support of her peers, Christiana nurtured her savings and leveraged the loan scheme offered by the group. *She borrowed Le 500 to procure school items and gain admission to Jiama Secondary School.*
